Our Reception teacher makes sure they visit each child in their nursery setting where possible. Children have opportunities to visit their new class and meet their new teacher. Teaching and Learning

The Power of Reading is used throughout the school and Read, Write Inc supports Phonics.

Foundation Stage and Year 1 have their own bespoke outdoor learning area.

Regular school trips and visitors enrich the children's learning. We use online learning tools such as Tapestry, Class Dojo and Plickers.

Special Educational Needs

Carleton Rode CEVA Primary is an inclusive school. We ensure that all children are included in all aspects of learning and school life. We place the child and their voice at the centre of our SEN practice and work with parents and carers in partnership to identify and address needs and plan actions.

Reception, Year 1 and Year 2 children are entitled to a free school dinner under the Government's Universal Infant Free School Meals.



If you are in receipt of certain benefits, you may be entitled to free school meals.

- The office staff will give you further details.
- We ask all parents to register their right to free school meals even if they choose to provide their own healthy packed lunch.
 This information is vital to school as it affects the Local Authority's funding of our school.
- The government provides free fruit for children in Reception and Key Stage One to eat at break-time. Key Stage Two children may bring in a healthy snack from home.
 - Please do not send in sweet snacks or crisps.
 - Please note, any food brought from home must be nut-free.





Carleton Rode Primary School is believed to be one of the oldest school sites in the county still using its original buildings - including a landmark bell tower. The school was built in 1822 and while it has benefitted from extensions, it is still in the exact same Victorian building.

As part of our 200th anniversary celebrations the school has purchased a bell, which itself dates back more than a 100 years, to install in the tower. After being awarded grant funding from the Heritage Lottery, the bell tower will once again have a toll.

The school held a special day to celebrate the occasion, which saw a ribbon cut for the new bell. It also saw a time capsule, buried in 1991 by former Norwich City defender Duncan Forbes, dug up and opened - before being returned back to the earth with new additions.

The honour of re-opening the capsule was given to Janette Forbes, wife of the late Canaries captain.

Educational Visits



We believe that visits and trips are very valuable and enrich the learning experience. Therefore, where possible we arrange visits to places which are linked to the topic the children are studying or organisations may visit the school.

The children in Years 5 and 6 have the opportunity to go on a biannual activity residential trip based usually in Norfolk or the surrounding area. Details of the visit are sent to parents / carers in advance and a contribution towards the cost is requested and is subsidised where possible for those children in receipt of Free School Meals etc. (via the Pupil Premium Grant).

We are legally bound not to make a profit from such school activities and always aim to keep the cost as low as possible.
